Star Awards will be presented <u>only</u> based on the information supplied in this report. Granges completing programming in all of the Star categories will be recognized as a Star Achievement Grange. Each Grange that submits a report with qualifying activities in any of the stars available will be awarded Star Certificates. All awards will be presented at the gala.

Outstanding Subordinate and Pomona Lecturer will be awarded as well as the Outstanding Program of the Year. Both of these awards will be recognized from information on this form.

The awards for Community Service activities will be based on information from the Community Service Report. The winning Grange's Combined Report, with the Community Service Report in the front, will be sent to the National Grange convention for consideration to be awarded at the National level. Adding references for the Community Service projects detailed in that report to the Grange's Star Reports is recommended, to call out those events for consideration toward the Lecturer Star awards. *Please do NOT duplicate these details in the Star Reports – do mention them though.* 

Submission of this entire combined report by Email is strongly preferred. Please email to your State Lecturer (BJ Bushman) and your Community Service Director (Lisa Mittan). You can also email to your Membership Director (Alan Caldwell) if you like, although he is specifically looking for the Membership Report. If email is absolutely impossible, please mail two printed copies of your report to BJ and Lisa, and a printed copy of the Membership report to Alan.

BJ, Lisa, and Alan will each need a copy of your reports by September 3, so there is time for them to thoroughly evaluate them all and prepare the prizes.

### ONE BOOK / SCRAPBOOK

We encourage each Grange to still do a One Book or Scrapbook as this is an historical record of your Grange and is a useful informational tool to use in recruitment or just to show who and what your Grange is, and what you do. You may choose to use a printed copy of your Combined Report as a framework on which to build your Scrapbook, to already have some of the content and also provide a way to organize your Scrapbook content.

Please send your Scrapbook with your Grange's delegates to State Session. It will NOT be used for judging the Star categories, or Community Service or Membership activities. If no one from your Grange will be attending State Session in September, you may mail your Scrapbook to either BJ or Lisa in time to allow for it to arrive so it can be carried to State Session for you. Your books will be judged at State Session and on view for the membership in attendance. Scrapbook awards will be Scrapbook Achievement, as well as 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> places. The Outstanding Scrapbook Award winner's book will travel to National Convention in November and then be returned to you. *This Award is separate from the Lecturer's Star and Community Service Awards*.

Granges do not need to create a Scrapbook to be eligible for the Lecturer's Star, Community Service, or Membership Awards.

# Lecturer Star Awards

Often our programs fit into more than one star category. Duplication is not necessary for the lecturer report. I suggest that you explain the program or event in the star category of this report where it fits best, and then mention the other colors of star categories that may fit as well. As an example: if your event fits best in the gold star, but also works for the green star, put information in the gold star and refer to the green star. Under the green star just put the name of the program and say "refer to gold star". You may add additional pages as necessary. The reports must be filled out completely to qualify for the awards. You may include samples of your work along with the report, such as a picture, flyer, etc. Please include <u>only</u> up to four samples per program/event. If completing your report on a computer, please insert images in with the story you're telling in that section of your report when you can. The State Grange would love to share your successes with other Lecturers; please give as many descriptive details as possible.

If your Grange has done something for the Food Sustainability Program, *and* it is also a good fit in one of the Star sections, please put your details and samples as an item under that Star and include which category / subcategory of the Food Sustainability Program applies. You can use only the Food Sustainability Program report form for those projects, if you choose. Please do not report the same event or project in both places.

Award judging will be done on the content, organization, and completeness of your Star Reports. There will be one overall Best Grange, as well as Lecturer's awards for other categories.

### Gold Star - Information

What educational, informational or pertinent community issues programs did your Grange sponsor or co-sponsor?
